IMPORTANT COVID INFORMATION FOR PERSONS TRAVELLING TO THE SINGAPORE CLASSIC, THAILAND CLASSIC AND HERO INDIAN OPEN

Singapore Classic

Anyone travelling to Singapore for the Singapore Classic who does not have proof of completing the primary course of vaccination will be required to receive a negative pre-travel covid test within 48 hours before departure. Persons must bring proof of vaccination **and travel insurance**. Current government requirements can be found [here](#).

The test can be:

- A PCR Test
- An Antigen Rapid Test (ART) administered by a trained professional, or self-self-administered ART that is remotely supervised

Those who have completed the primary course of vaccination for one of the above vaccines are not required to test before entering Singapore.

If a person has not completed the primary course of vaccination but has documented proof of testing positive for covid in the last 14-90 days before departure to Singapore, a pre-departure test is not required. You can check eligibility [here](#).

If you are at the Ras Al Khaimah Championship you will be able to undertake a PCR test on-site. Please contact Steph Carew-Gibbs (SCarew-Gibbs@europeantourgroupp.com).

Persons travelling to Singapore should check their own requirements, and where relevant carry proof of vaccination. It is your responsibility to source a test if you require one, but for those travelling from the Ras Al Khaimah Championship, this can be facilitated on site.

Thailand Classic

Currently travellers do not need to present a COVID-19 related document such as certificate of vaccination or COVID-19 test results upon arrival in Thailand. This includes anyone who has attended Singapore Classic.

Hero Indian Open

Currently everyone travelling from Thailand Classic to Hero Indian Open requires a PCR test within 72 hours before departure to India.

You will be able to undertake a test on-site in Thailand, a separate note with onsite testing information will be sent in due course. Please bring your travel document (passport). Tests will be free of charge for players/caddies and your result will be sent out to you via email.

If a person returns a positive test in Thailand, they will be allowed to continue participating in Thailand but cannot travel to India, you will also be able to travel onwards to a destination which does not require pre travel test. Please check requirements for your travel destination if you wish to return home.

Once you have received your result, you will be required to complete a self-declaration form and upload result on the Air Suvudha portal (www.newdelhiairport.in) before travel.

Please note any travellers whose first point of embarkment is China, Singapore, Hong Kong, Republic of Korea, Thailand or Japan will be required to PCR test within 72 hours before departure to India.

Further information on testing requirements for future tournaments will be sent out accordingly.
